- I am completing my degree, can I still make an application?
- Yes, you can continue to make an application and if successful at shortlisting and interview a conditional offer will be made subject to you gaining the necessary degree outcome before August 31.
- My degree isn't related to a national curriculum subject, will you accept it?
- A Yes.

- Yes, you can continue to make an application and if successful at shortlisting and interview a conditional offer will be made, subject to you gaining the necessary qualification prior to the 31st August.
- What equivalent exams do you accept?
- A We accept exams from www.equivalencytesting.com
- I have an adult literacy/numeracy level 2, is this acceptable?
- A No, unfortunately we do not accept adult literacy or adult numeracy level 2 as GCSE equivalent.
- I have international qualifications. What do I do?
- A You contact UK NARIC on www.naric.org.uk/

- Do I have to apply through DfE Apply or UCAS?
- A Yes, you apply through DfE Apply or UCAS, there are no exceptions.
- What is the course code for the SSF SCITT course I'm interested in?
- A See page 10 for DfE Apply/UCAS codes.
- **Q** What campus code do I use?
- A Simply select the closest option to your home address.

 This will not be your host school but will help us to place you into the best geographical cohort.
- I want a salaried place but don't have a school. Can I still apply?
- A You can still apply but we advise that you seek a supporting school. Some schools advertise for salaried applicants on their website.
- I have no school experience, what do I do?
- Although there is no requirement to undertake school experience we advise that a small amount of experience in a school prior to application would be beneficial. Previous applicants have enjoyed spending time in a school environment and career changers in particular have commented upon how much schools have changed since they were at school. Contact your local schools who largely welcome short voluntary experiences, especially when linked to possible application for teacher training.

- I don't have a supporting school, will you help me to find one?
- Tuition fee and PGCE applicants we will aim to place you in a school as close to your home as possible.

- Will I be expected to teach a class on day one of the programme?

- A Our tuition fee and PGCE programmes start initially with small groups of children, building up to teaching one lesson and by the summer term you will be teaching the children four days of the week. Postgraduate Teaching Apprentices will have a teaching commitment in the autumn term from day one.
- **Q** Do I have to pass tests in Maths and English?
- All applicants to initial teacher training in the UK will have to demonstrate competence in fundamental skills (English and mathematics) by the end of the training year. Our training includes support with this.
- What will I be paid as a Postgraduate Apprentice?
- A You will be employed by a supporting school and paid on the unqualified teachers' scale (minimum point 1).
