

Great news! Let's ensure you have the necessary qualifications to join one of our courses.


You'll need a:

- Minimum of a Grade C (or a new grade 4) GCSE in maths, English and science or equivalent,
- An honours degree or equivalent

If you tick both boxes you can submit an application via UCAS.

Before starting any initial teacher training course with us you'll also have to undertake the **professional skills tests**.

And you'll need some classroom experience.

- 1 am completing my degree, can I still make an application?
- Yes, you can continue to make an application and if successful at shortlisting and interview a conditional offer will be made subject to you gaining the necessary degree outcome before August 31.
- My degree isn't related to a national curriculum subject, will you accept it?
- A Yes.
- a I don't have one of my GCSEs, can I still make an application?
- A You'll need to gain the necessary qualification before August 31.
- What equivalent exams do you accept?
- A We accept exams from www.equivalencytesting.com
- I have an adult literacy/numeracy level 2, is this acceptable?
- A No, unfortunately we do not accept adult literacy or adult numeracy level 2 as GCSE equivalent.
- I have an international qualifications. What do I do?
- A You contact UK NARIC on www.naric.org.uk/

- Do I have to apply through UCAS?
- A Yes, there are no exceptions. The <u>UCAS site</u> is the place to go to begin your application.
- What is the course code for the SSF SCITT course I'm interested in?
- A See page 10 for UCAS course codes.
- I want a salaried place but don't have a school. Can I still apply?
- You can still apply but we advise that you seek a supporting school. Some schools advertise for salaried applicants on their website.
- I have no school experience, what do I do?
- A You will need a minimum of two weeks experience in a school prior to application. Contact one of your local schools who largely welcome short voluntary experiences, especially when linked to possible application for initial teacher training courses.
- I don't have a supporting school, will you help me to find one?
- A Yes. We will aim to place you in a school as close to your home as possible.

- Will I be expected to teach a class on day one of the programme?
- No. Our tuition fee programme starts initially with small groups of children, building up to teaching one lesson and by the summer term you will be teaching the children four days of the week. Salaried trainees will have a gradually increasing timetable.
- **Q** Do I have to apply for the bursary (Primary General with mathematics)?
- No. If you are eligible you are automatically entitled to the bursary. Click here for more information. The ITT Director is responsible for ensuring these payments are made to you from October to July.
- **O** Do I have to pass the professional skills tests?
- Yes. If you have not passed the skills tests in English and maths by the August 31 you will not be able to commence the programme on September 1. There is more information available online.
